Service Rewards: Service has helped my recovery in so many ways. If I hadn't gotten active in service, I'm not sure I would still be going to meetings. My first service position was group treasurer and that responsibility gave me the reason to attend the meeting, to make sure January/February 2016

someone was there to count the money and keep it in a safe place. Next came Group Rep, and I felt I needed to attend the meeting just in case something came up for the GR to attend to. It may have been to make an announcement that came in the newsletter, or providing information from the AIS. As GR I started to attend AIS and then the Area events.

My recovery really started to soar when I began to attend area assemblies. My first experience at assembly was scary, but I kept going back because I liked what I saw. The people there had something I wanted. They seemed happy and productive, even though most were living with active alcoholism.

The following words come to mind when I think of service rewards: opportunity, chance, knowledge based decisions, confidence, leadership, participation, Erie Canal, "presume goodwill," "principles above personalities," "participation is the key to harmony," "mutual respect," "unity, "keep an open mind," " listen and learn," and friendship. I had the opportunity to grow in my program when I became active in service. I've had a chance to develop skills, gain confidence, learn about leadership, and keep an open mind while staying focused, and able to listen. For me, service has been a safe place to practice what I have learned in an environment that isn't critical and judgmental. One of the biggest rewards service has offered me is the ability to agree to disagree, and still remain on good terms. To be able to have a difference of opinion during a meeting, and then share a meal together afterwards, that's a true reward. Another reward has to do with the concept of knowledge-based decision-making and the importance of understanding something fully before making choices and decisions. I have learned that a decision doesn't have to be made immediately: I can take my time, so I understand everything involved. Sometimes, making no decision is a decision in itself.

A deeper study and use of the Steps, Traditions, and Concepts has also been a reward, and has helped strengthen my understanding of the Al-Anon program, of myself, and others.
