This month our topic is, "Asking for Help." Al-Anon service has helped my recovery soar. Before I became active in service. I thought that asking for help with anything was a sign of weakness. Today I can say that asking for help is strength. It means I have grown so much and am comfortable with saying, "I don't know everything, I can't do it alone and I require help." I started out by asking my Higher Power for help and trusting in the outcome. Having that faith in my Higher Power gave me the courage to ask for help from others. Many times over my term as NYN Chairman I have had to ask for help from other members. Guess what? The response was overwhelming. We worked together and resolved the issue at hand. All I had to do was reach-out and ask and they were there to help. This newfound trust in others is starting to take shape in all of my affairs.

In my last article, I wrote about the need to finalize discussions relevant to the NYN Alateen Requirements & Guidelines and get the final updates placed into policy. I feel this topic warrants being repeated, so all voting members of the NYN Area Assembly have full knowledge of the proposed changes and updates and our discussion can occur at the Spring Assembly.

If you remember, our presentation last spring was centered around, "Reaching an Informed Group Conscience Using Knowledge-Based Decision Making (KBDM)." The four basic elements of KBDM are:

- Open communication between leadership
 and membership
- All decision makers have common access to full information
- Dialogue before deliberation
- We exist in a culture of trust.

The committee has worked on the NYN Alateen Requirements and Guidelines updates and provided the information regarding the proposed changes. Now it's time for the Assembly members to review and be ready for discussion. The proposed updates can be found on the website at: http://www.nynafg.com/pdf/2013/0921alateenGuid.pdf

Please begin discussions at the group and district level relevant to the proposed *NYN Alateen Requirements & Guidelines*. Use your links of service: contact your District Rep (DR) who can reach out to the AWSC or the NYN Alateen Coordinator to answer your questions and express your thoughts and concerns, or contact the NYN Alateen Coordinator directly. You can feel free to reach out directly to me, and I will get the answers to your questions, relay your concerns, etc. to the committee.

As an Area, we need to talk to each other and reason things out while having mutual respect for one another. We can achieve this by bringing the Higher Power into the discussions, by placing principles above personalities, by looking to the Traditions for the answers and by keeping these 3 points in mind:

Is it accurate? Does it provide clarity? Can we live with it?

Let's ask ourselves these questions as we put the updated NYN Alateen Requirements & Guidelines into place to protect the Alateen members, Alateen groups sponsors and AMIAS's, as well as NYN and Alateen as a whole.

There is a section in the new Service Manual entitled, "Alateen Policy" which starts on page 87 and continues on to page 94. But more importantly, on the new, updated members' website www.alanon.alateen.org/members there is an Alateen Service e-manual that can answer many of your questions if you are thinking about starting an Alateen group. Included are some of the concerns and other helpful ideas from the World Service Office (WSO). Just remember that each area has their own requirements and guidelines. Speaking of which, our New York North (NYN) Area revised Alateen Guidelines and Requirements are on the New York North website under newsflash. The black lettering is the original wording, red lettering is removed text and green lettering is the revised or reworded text as needed.

Please print these off so you can review them with your district, groups, and yourself as we will be addressing these at the Assembly this spring. Now is the time to bring up things that you are unclear about, or ask questions or otherwise familiarize yourself with the proposed revision. Let's talk things over and reason things out together to keep Alateen a safe place for our Alateen Group Sponsors and our Alateens. We need to send WSO a copy of our requirements this year, as they have requested us to do so.

On Topic: "Asking for Help." The first step through the doors of Al-Anon was my very first attempt at asking for help. I did not realize it at the time; I just had not had any success with any of my other attempts to deal with the disease of alcoholism. When I had been in Al-Anon for awhile, I realized that I needed to get a sponsor, which entailed humbling myself enough to reach out and ask. The best lesson for me of asking for help has been being involved in service to Al-Anon. There were things I did not know how to do, or needed a better way to accomplish what I was attempting to do; the old ways didn't work so well anymore. Learning that other people had done these jobs before and were available to help me find my path through new territory, was both humbling and joyful. Because I had to ask for help, the realization dawned that we never have to do these things alone, as long as we ask.

Inquiries from our website have been fairly light since I started answering them last June. This job is about dealing with newcomers in a lot of pain, just as we all were once. It is very gratifying to deal with newcomers one-on-one, to be the first to greet them, and help ease them into the program.

One of these days, I will have to give up this post, but I'm not looking forward to it. On the other hand, I believe in rotation of service, and am glad for the opportunities that have helped me progress. When my term is up, I hope to pass it on, so others can also grow in this program.

I just did my first shift in the Area Information Service (AIS) office in a long time, and talked to a newcomer about the suitability of Al-Anon for her, the mother of an addict. I am not the gatekeeper. I am a "true believer" in this program, and can't think of a soul it wouldn't benefit.

This months' topic is "Asking For Help." When I arrived in Al-Anon, the idea of asking for help was out of the question. Just thinking about it would make me resentful, because I projected refusal. At work, it seemed dog-eat-dog, and asking would be a sign of weakness to be used against me. There were exceptions, a few friends I could ask. But, as I progressed in the program, there were more people I could ask, knowing they would help me. Learning to ask for help was part of the process of Al-Anon, like a layer of an onion to be peeled away.

I've learned that asking for help in Al-Anon can also benefit those who are asked, because it makes them feel important to the program, which they are. A general plea to the membership doesn't get much of a response, but one-on-one is both a compliment and harder to refuse. Just ask me.

Immediate Past Delegate:

As I think about this month's topic "asking for help," I come away with the conclusion that most of what I learn in the Al-Anon program is tied to "asking for help." When we reach the rooms of Al-Anon, we quickly learn that what we have been doing is not working and we are hopeful that you will give us the quick fix and we can get on with our lives. However, those of us who stay to get the complete answer quickly learn that it is not an overnight fix but rather, a life long journey of changing ourselves into the person we wish to be.

It's about learning to work a set of principles contained in the Twelve Steps, the Twelve Traditions and the Twelve Concepts. Whether we work these Steps, Traditions and Concepts vertically or horizontally; the principles embodied here are reminding us of a dependence on a Higher Power and the help of other Al-Anon members if we are to have a successful recovery. My first clue that I need to "ask for help."

As I looked at our Al-Anon literature, I was struck by the number of readings on this very topic in *Courage to Change* and *Hope for Today*. The other source on this topic I found in *Paths to Recovery B-24,* which is a wonderful discussion of using the Steps, Traditions and Concepts in our daily lives.

An essential ingredient in my ability to ask for help is humility, and I particularly like the quote on page 142 in *Courage to Change*, "Humility will help us see ourselves in true perspective and keep our minds open to the truth" (from *Alcoholism, The Family Disease*). A second ingredient necessary when "asking for help" is willingness. Without these two ingredients of humility and willingness, I will have little chance of success with "asking for help."

More important than these two essential ingredients is a belief in a Higher Power. I need to have developed a relationship with the God of my understanding and be willing to allow that God or Higher Power to give me direction in how I attempt to live my life out. With daily prayer and meditation with the God of my understanding I am daily asking for help in living out the challenges that face me. To aide me in my daily quest for knowledge of my Higher Power's will for me, I find helpful the prayer found on pages 214-15 of *As We Understood B-11*.

Service in the Al-Anon program has been one of the main ways in which I have been successful in "asking for help," which then encourages me to reach out and "ask for help" in other areas of my life. When we take on a job or a project in Al-Anon, we are frequently encouraged to ask others to join us in carrying out the project. This can be a very rewarding way of learning new things and making new friends. Expanding our horizons can be a result of "asking for help."

So, with the help of my Higher Power whom I reach out to in daily prayer and meditation; willingness to recover and humility, I can "ask for help" and be open to new possibilities to occur in my life. This process involves not only my Higher Power but my fellow Al-Anon members, my sponsor and the many tools this program provides me with for having a better life. I am reminded to be open to the possibilities that will take me to places beyond my wildest dreams. "Asking for help" is not always easy but it's better than staying stuck. Hello There,

Topic this month: "Asking for Help." In my life before Al-Anon it never occurred to me that I ever needed help. After all, I was the "rock" and "foundation" upon which my family relied. Here, I took the risk to love myself enough to ask for help. Thanks to my Higher Power, when I do have a task that seems overwhelming, I can ask for help. Surprisingly, the work gets done even when I'm not the one doing it. In the past, I tried reaching out for help to friends and family members who did not understand the disease of alcoholism. These experiences left me feeling guilty, ashamed and determined to do "it" myself. A key element of my recovery has been to become willing to seek and accept help from others. Before I began my recovery, I expected those close to me to know I needed -- even expected their help! I could not understand why I did not get any responses. I no longer expect you to read my mind. Today I treat the people in my life with respect, and I am learning to ask for what I need.

The most difficult relationship I have right now, is the one I have with me. Each day I must remind myself to stop and ask for my Higher Power's help and direction. I lay awake just the other night, trying to find a solution to a family problem. I got out of bed and sat quietly in the dark on a rocking chair which has been in my family for generations. As I sat there, a sense of peace came over me, and the answer became clear: It was not my problem, I needed to do nothing. **Sometimes doing nothing is doing something.** I smiled, got back in bed and slept peacefully the rest of the night. The next morning I took time to thank my Higher Power. When we ask, He always answers.

Each quarter the World Service Office (WSO) posts a sample chapter of Conference Approved Literature (CAL) on both the Public Outreach site, <u>www.al-</u> <u>anon.org</u> and the Members' site, <u>www.al-anon.org/</u> <u>members</u> Through March the chapter is from**In** *All Our Affairs* (B-15).

Each month, the "CAL Corner" feature in *The Forum* includes members' sharings on how a particular piece of our literature has enhanced their recovery. March's article will focus on *Courage to Change* (B-16).

Sharings are needed for "CAL Corner": We always need more sharings about how CAL has helped members with their recovery. I like to see what our current assets and liabilities are at the end of the each month. Then I like to see a somewhat detailed report of income and expenses. For example, I like to see a recording of my group's contributions to New York North (NYN) to make sure they have been received. Then, I also like to be able to review expenses to make sure they seem somewhat reasonable. I also like to add up the numbers to make sure it all makes sense and proves out each month. I also like as complete a calendar of events as can be assembled, to help me keep up to date and plan my year. In general, I like to know what the officers and coordinators are doing, what they have been successful in doing, what they have been struggling to accomplish, what they need help with."

I have also gotten a question about an answer to the Scavenger Hunt from Mark J., a Group Representative (GR) for a local Al-Anon group who says, *"At our monthly District Meeting we look up the "Scavenger Hunt" questions in the* Al-Anon Service Manual. *This month's question was, "Do The Trustees have a legal right of veto over the conference?" I know that the answer is yes, as the* Manual *states on p. 197, "The Trustees have a legal right of veto over the Conference when, in rare cases, they feel it should be used." I asked my group for examples of such cases where the Trustees would exercise this veto power. They were unsure and asked me to forward the question to* Northern Hi Lights *for clarification."* I was very happy to know that the Scavenger Hunt was being used as a Service Tool. I didn't know the answer myself, but was able to "Ask for Help" from our Area Chair, Pam A. and our recent New York North (NYN) Trustee, Anne F.

John O. did a fabulous job of printing out and mailing the hardcopies of the J/F 2014 issue of *NHL*, saving the Area much needed funds. Thank you John for your willingness and hard work. On another note, I am still investigating where our *NHL* mission statement originated. Neither Lavaughn R. nor Mary G. were sure, as it was already in place when they were editors of *NHL*.
