I felt the unconditional love and support that the teens and sponsors gave with just hugging me. I do believe that this was the beginning of my feelings of acceptance of myself as a human being, and of the people in this program who said they loved me! Thank you Al-Anon and Alateen for this lovely spiritual gift. I just received a copy of the 2016 Board of Trustees letter and some of the things they discussed are as follows:

"This [Nominating]Committee aids the Trustees in discharging their prime obligation to see that all vacancies within the Board of Trustees or its Executive Committees are filled with those of the greatest possible competence, stability, and industry." The list of nominees is presented to the World Service Conference for traditional approval of Regional Trustees, Trustees At Large, Board Officers, and At-Large members of the Executive Committee for Real Property Management. The Board is looking forward to visiting with Al-Anon and Alateen members who attend the "Meet the Board" event in Fayetteville, Arkansas on October 22, 2016. They discussed the effective communication using AFGCONNECTS. They were excited that those service leaders who have access to it (DRs, Area Officers and Coordinators), are embracing the discussion threads. They hope all members that have access to a community on **AFG**CONNECTS will continue using this valuable resource to share concerns and experience with others in the same community. Unfortunately, at this time it is not available to the general membership. But we will do our best to keep all members informed.

The Question they presented to us is: What is your Area doing to celebrate Al-Anon Family Group's 65th anniversary Because we have not discussed this yet I do not have an answer, but will ask you all for suggestions, and will bring it up at the AWSC meeting in April. It would be nice to know we celebrated in a way that will continue to help make Al-Anon be a viable source of healing for those who continue to need it.

I am preparing to attend NERD and will be presenting a timely topic item to discuss with other delegates about the problem with attendance at Area Assemblies. These are the items that I want to present:

1. Some districts do not have district representatives, so there is no one to carry the information back to the group representative in these districts.

2. Many groups have only a Current Mailing Address (CMA). CMA's do not feel the need to attend assemblies. This creates problems, because decisions for our Area are made and voted on by the group representatives attending that Assembly. When only a small number of groups make decisions that affect our whole area, we are not being a representative body of service. We find that many of these groups that are small have very little contact with each other. and very few years of recovery in them. They don't know the importance of our Legacy of Service.

My concern is that by WSO projecting the need for groups to have only a CMA in order to receive

groups to have only a CMA in order to receive information, that groups do not feel the need to form the Links of Service.

I will share with you any ideas we receive that can help us to solve this issue. AA

Hi Everyone,

- March 4th is Lois W.'s birthday and a perfect time to get together with fellow Al-Anon members for a viewing of the AV-1 and AV-24 videos, recently released on DVD. For more information, and to schedule the DVD's for a week's rental during a time that is convenient for you and based on availability, download the S-35 order form for AV-1 and AV-24 from the Al-Anon Online Store, and mail or fax to WSO. Please place your order three weeks in advance of when the DVD's will be needed. Also, remember to "forget" a piece of our public outreach information somewhere in your community.
- A reminder that April is "Alcohol Awareness" month. Last year many of us asked our libraries if we could set up a display using our Al-Anon literature and our outreach materials. I'm hoping we can have greater participation this year.—Will you help?
- A couple of events took place recently in Rochester. Brian O., our public outreach chair for Rochester AIS, along with other Al-Anon members, did a half hour presentation for 30 professionals at a treatment center. Fact Sheets for Professionals, Alateen information and meeting lists were made available. Brian brought his daily readers, and mentioned that our literature can be ordered online. The audience seemed genuinely interested. Our members answered many questions about what Al-Anon is and is not. (Several of the professionals didn't realize that members of AA could attend Al-Anon.)
- Another event took place at a health center where approximately 125 people were in attendance. Our outreach materials were made available. Brian sent "Thank you"

- notes to both the treatment and health centers. He will be notified of upcoming events.
- In Albany on April 18th there will be a health fair at St. Rose College. We have been invited to participate and I am in touch with the public outreach chair of District 8, Deb. W. as well as Kevin, the DR for District 8, and Bob, the DR from District 7. I've been told that about 400-500 students will be attending.

Recently I received, through e-communities, information about the new "road sign design for local adaption." If you go to the members' website and click on public outreach and then click on tools and scroll to the bottom of the page you will see it. Please remember that we need to get final approval from WSO regarding any sign or poster that we put together. Let me know if I can be of help.

Thanks John for our topic this month, "Hugs and Acceptance." As you have said "Hugs can be a symbol of acceptance and being accepted is so important to all." I agree with you, it feels good to be accepted by others and to reach out to others by giving a hug. For me it says; "I care about you and I'm glad to see you." Sometimes though, the body language of a person says "no hug" and I respect that. There are other ways to let someone know that one is glad to see them.

Something else I was thinking about was my wanting others to accept me before I accept myself. This certainly was the case when I came to Al-Anon: people pleasing, no conflict, go along with, no trouble. Today it is more important for me to be true to myself than to have others approve of me. I like the reading in *Courage to Change*, page 261, as it speaks to the need for balance between the desire to be accepted by others and the need to be true to oneself.

Attention all Group Representatives: As the NYN Area's *Forum* Representative, I would like to draw your attention to the letter from Al-Anon's World Service Office (WSO) that appeared in the last issue of *Northern Hi Lights*, in which WSO informed us that they will no longer be providing free monthly copies of *The Forum* to groups after March 2016. This is due to "decreased literature sales and increased costs."

In order to keep receiving *The Forum* after March, 2016 each group will need to send in a yearly subscription request for \$11. This form can be found on the last page of each *Forum*. Subscribe now to be sure your group does not miss a single issue of this great little magazine, full of sharings from members around the world and helpful Al-Anon tools. If your group simply cannot afford the subscription cost, perhaps your district could help out? In addition, individual members can subscribe electronically for \$1.49 per issue and access the magazine by smart phone or other device.

My job as Alternate Delegate, to welcome new groups to Al-Anon, has been very quiet. I have not received notice of any new groups yet this year.

On Topic: 'Hugs and Acceptance': When I first came to Al-Anon, I felt like an outsider. I simply could not figure out how to accept myself or others. I had the usual 'ism' symptoms of being critical, judgmental, and fearful. I felt either superior to - or inferior to - others, never an equal.

In the beginning, I made sure to scoot out quickly after each meeting in order to avoid these painful feelings. I started to convince myself that I couldn't belong to this group either, when one member started to give me a hug after each meeting and say a few words to me. This gave me enough hope to keep coming back.

Then, at my first Assembly/Convention as a Group Representative, those old feelings of being separate came back, because I didn't know very many people there. Luckily, that same member noticed I was in pain and took a few minutes to ask if I wanted to go somewhere quiet and talk. For the first time I remember, I did not feel invisible anymore!

We never know how powerful our simple gestures of kindness can be to those still hurting from the effects of Alcoholism. Thank you Al-Anon members for your Hugs and Acceptance: You (and they) are the true revolutionaries, and have saved me from a life of pain and separation. My heart is filled with gratitude.

Hugs and acceptance. After my first few months attending Al-Anon meetings I discovered that hugs and acceptance were part of the recovery process in the rooms. I found that what I said in meetings was accepted for what it was. There was no judgement. There was no, "you shouldn't feel that way," or "you should feel this way." The unconditional acceptance by others in the program has allowed me to change, and to be accepting of others and their individuality, in all of my affairs. Now that's a true gift of the program. Hugs are something I've learned to accept. I'm not a cuddly person and I don't like anyone in my space so it took a while to understand that Al-Anon hugs are okay, even occasionally nice, although I do need to be asked first. To be honest, I'm usually moving too fast to bother with hugs, which brings me to the Acceptance topic: I've been learning acceptance because I got pneumonia for Halloween...and Thanksgiving...and Christmas....

I'm finally better, but you can bet I was doing some heavy-duty acceptance about how much sleep I needed and how many activities I couldn't do.

The interesting thing is, while I was recuperating, I got to learn about doing stuff slooooooooooowly. My HP allowed me to figure out that if I tried to do things at my normal pace, I was going to crash and burn. Then HP helped me learn to do things one at a time. I didn't multitask. I just did the thing in front of me. For instance, putting on my socks took five minutes, and that was all I was doing. It drove me BONKERS. Then I started to get some acceptance about the whole deal and found that there's something kind of peaceful and meditative about being that slow. I started to notice light, texture, sounds, and other details that I usually just skip right over, whether I was putting on my socks or brushing my teeth or just sitting down for a rest.

Now that I'm better I'm trying to remember to keep the pace slow. It's super difficult because as usual there's a ton of stuff I'm totally psyched to do. But that lesson in acceptance was a big deal. Accepting the human paces around me gives me the chance to dawdle, to notice things, to feel what it feels like to be a human being in the world, rather than an over-caffeinated hyperspace flying squirrel with spring-loaded sneakers. Sometimes I even slow down enough to give or receive a hug—but please ask first.


