Hosting an Assembly/Convention is a great way to build District camaraderie. Think about it.... I have appointed Sherry S. from District 6 as our acting Public Outreach Coordinator for the remainder of Panel 52's term. Thanks, Sherry for saying yes to Service.

Also on the spring agenda is our Delegate's report from the World Service Conference. 2014 is an election year and at the Fall Assembly we will be electing a new panel of Officers and Coordinators to represent NYN for the next three years. Many of the Officers and Coordinators will give presentations on their current service positions. We also have something special in store from our Presentation Committee.

I hope to see many of you at our 2014 Spring Assembly. I plan on bringing my passport and camera and doing some sightseeing at the Falls.

Dear NYN Friends,

Well, in a little over a week from today I will be on my way to the 54<sup>th</sup> World Service Conference. Most likely by the time you read this I will be home and preparing my report for the New York North (NYN) Spring Assembly/Convention. I still find it hard to believe that this is my final Conference!

This month's theme is "Participation is the key to Harmony," the Fourth Concept. What a great thing to be thinking about as I prepare to attend the World Service Conference. My being willing to participate in service at all levels is what has led me to my current position. When I began in Al-Anon I had no idea what service was all about. I did hear about Group Representatives (GRs), Districts, Area meetings and the Delegate, but I really didn't know what these meant. I began to hear how others' service experiences had helped their recovery.

Then they would share how only good things had come from those leaps of faith; that the fear they had opened new doors for them when they stepped up to take a new service position. Hearing them gave me permission to take my own leaps of faith, to step up to a new position even when I had said I would never be able to do that.

We have all heard that it is only in giving it away that we can keep it. I am so blessed that I have been able to learn how very true this is. When I think of all the wonderful people I have come to know who practice this saying every day I am amazed.

When I hear the word harmony I think of music, beautiful music. When I hear the Fourth Concept read I think of all the beautiful music that I have in my life. It is another blessing in my life in recovery.

I look forward to seeing all of you at the Spring Assembly/Convention May 16 – 18. I hope to share with you how I experienced "Participation is the Key to Harmony" at the World Service Conference.

## **Immediate Past Delegate:**

"Participation is the Key to Harmony," the Fourth Concept, is our theme this month and a great follow-up to last month's topic, "Fully Self-Supporting." We need for all of our members to participate if we are going to be fully self-supporting. As I read through the literature and thought about this topic, I was remembering a piece that appeared in an issue of The Forum; so I went on a hunt for that issue of *The Forum* and was lucky to pinpoint it in a short period of time. What struck me about the piece in The Forum was how it related to this month's topic of participation. It was about the "Three Obstacles to Success in Al-Anon" at that time, a recent addition to the 2010-2013 Service *Manual* and also found in the pamphlet "Alcoholism, the Family Disease" (P-4).

When we talk about this Fourth Concept, "Participation is the Key to Harmony," we are reminded of how each of the players in a musical group needs to do their individual part so that when the group comes together to play a musical piece there will be harmony. The same is true in Al-Anon; we need each of our members to do his or her part so that the Group, District, local AIS or Area will function to the best of their ability. When we study the "Links of Service" (S-28), we realize there are many members needed in order for our service structure to work effectively. Service can be a key to our recovery. I have had many character flaws tested as I have done service, but each time I have been given an opportunity to do better and to grow in this program of recovery.

Al-Anon has taught me many new behaviors such as learning what my job is and then doing it to the best of my ability. It has taught me that after doing a job for the suggested amount of time it is then time to turn it over to another member; this is rotation of service. I also need to allow that person to do the job to the best of their ability without me looking over their shoulder and telling them how to do the job; micro-managing the details of how the job is done.

This brings me back to *The Forum* article of March, 2011, about one of "The Three Obstacles to Success," which is dominance. After reading this article, I was struck by how *dominance can be quiet and subtle or loud and intimidating*. Dominance can be a way of not allowing Group members the opportunity to hold discussions and make Group decisions which can be for the greater good of the Group and for Al-Anon as a whole by allowing all Group members to come to an "Informed Group Conscience." Some of the subtle ways in which members dominate a meeting is by making decisions for a Group by not bring copies of the Area

newsletter or local AIS newsletter to the Group. When there is an Area appeal or the quarterly appeal from the WSO, these envelops for individual contributions are not brought to the Group for each member to make their own decision about whether to contribute or not. This subtle dominance is obstructing the participation of the Group members and not allowing for harmony within the Group.

How do the Groups you attend assure that there is harmony in your Group, District, Area and Al-Anon as a whole? Are the members who are serving doing their job to bring harmony?



Hello NYN,

I have received a very timely and informative answer back from Tom C. at the World Service Office (WSO) on the question of how much can be quoted from Conference Approved Literature (CAL) in Area newsletters before we need written permission from WSO. The answer is, "In accordance with page 107-108 of the 2014-2017 Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual, all quotations from CAL require written permission to be included in newsletters....Please also note that even if you receive permission to reprint CAL in your newsletter, this does not apply if you plan to post the newsletter on the Internet." To reflect this clarification, I have taken out the word "substantial" in reference to guotes from CAL in our Mission Statement. It now reads, "...all quotes from Conference Approved Literature (CAL) must have prior written permission from the World Service Office."

Please note that Group Records (not the newsletter editor) handles all subscription related questions for the *Northern Hi Lights*. Please email your subscription questions to <a href="mailto:records@nynafg.com">records@nynafg.com</a>, or mail to the Group Records address on the back page. Thank you.
