Hello NYN,

In working the Steps little by little, my life has changed. These changes occurred over time; they didn't happen overnight. I can see the change by looking back, but not staying there. I had to go to lots of meetings and read lots of Conference Approved Literature (CAL) to be able to begin working the Steps. I find going to Step meetings has helped enormously. Being able to be honest with others without fear of judgment and criticism has been a freeing experience. As a member of the human race, I am finding out that I'm no different than any other human being.

Recently, I was at a 4th Step meeting and was able to identify a shortcoming that I have been ignoring. We read from *Paths to Recovery* and then go around the group, read a question and give our response. During that meeting, when it was my turn to share, guess what, the question I got was the one I really needed. I found myself doing the 5th Step by admitting to God, myself and other human beings the exact nature of my wrongs. I am continuing to examine that shortcoming and have come to the conclusion that I know God can remove the behavior and I have asked him to do so. I asked him to help me become a better person and to change my ways. I will continue to pray and meditate on that shortcoming. My changed

I just received words from the World Service Office (WSO) that *One Day at a Time (B-6)* is now available as an audio book. It is currently on sale at Audible.com, and it will shortly be on Amazon.com and at the Apple iTunes Store. There is a sample chapter available on those websites. The listening length is 7 hours and 48 minutes. The book is narrated by anonymous AI-Anon members whose willingness to participate in this service made the audio book possible.

I didn't get this information into my report. The WSO is looking for people who can translate English into French or Spanish. This would be to translate the written word. If your skills are good and you might want to try this service opportunity please contact the WSO.

This month's theme is "Working the Steps." I have just a few short thoughts; after spending the last two weeks writing my Delegate's report my brain is a little fried. Anyway, here are some of the things that come to mind when I think about "Working the Steps." I really didn't start to "work the Steps" until I got a sponsor and began work with her. Before that I heard the Steps and sometimes was able to use a Step or two by luck, but I needed to reason things out with someone else before I could really "work" them. I began to attend a Step and Tradition study meeting. That every-week concentration on each Step and Tradition was what I needed to really begin to understand them and be able to apply them in every aspect of my life. This is my Home Group and we are now a Legacy Study group.

Where does this feeling come from, what can I do to navigate through these feelings?
That's how I use the Steps today."*

Topic: "Spiritual Awakening"*

Immediate Past Delegate:

We have all heard the term “working the Steps.” So, what does that mean to me? The short answer to that question is that it means that I have progressed through the Twelve Steps and am now ready to do what the Twelfth Step suggests; to practice all the principles that I have learned in the previous eleven Steps in all my affairs. Next question: What are these principles? As suggested in *Paths to Recovery (B-24)* on page 123, they are the common principles of honesty, compassion, love, trust, humility, willingness, forgiveness and freedom. These are but a few of the principles which Al-Anon has helped me nurture as I have grown and done service in the program. In other words, I share my experience, strength and hope using these principles as I progress in Al-Anon and live a life with less stress and chaos.

In late September, we will be holding our Election Assembly for the purpose of electing our Area’s new trusted servants to the various officer and coordinator positions. For me, that will mean I will be looking at what new role I can take in our Area Assembly. Does that mean I might be looking to fill one of these Area positions? No, my hope is to continue to be a part of the NYN Area Assembly and to find a meaningful way of sharing some of what has been given to me.

For me, “working the Steps” needs to include doing service, for this is how I grow in the Al-Anon program.

Today, as I was looking for a particular piece of Al-Anon literature, I came across an Alateen flyer that talked about “RECYCLE YOUR PROGRAM.” It went on to say that this is one way of sharing our experience, strength and hope. So, the next thing I did was to look in the dictionary for the meaning of “recycle.” To pass through a series of changes or to adapt to new uses, were two of the ideas suggested. I believe that this is what I do when I “work the Steps.” I pass through a series of changes as I work to find new ways of improving the way I participate in my life situations while working my Al-Anon program. To do this, I need to continually attend meetings, talk with my Al-Anon friends, read Al-Anon literature and be involved in service.

So, come January 2015, I will be working at “RECYCLING MY PROGRAM” so that I can continue to grow and change to be a better me. I need to be willing to give back some of what this program has given to me. Most importantly, I will do this with the help of my Higher Power leading the

way; and in order to do this I must work the first three Steps. I can’t; He can; so why not let Him? The next three Steps will help me uncover the defects of character which need my attention; and I will be led by my Higher as to how to do this. Steps Seven through Nine will give me the guidance of my Higher Power, the opportunity to make any amends and to begin to find new behaviors. The Tenth through the Twelfth Step will provide me with the opportunity to take a daily inventory of my behavior and to continue to improve my conscious contact with the God of my understanding. Finally, I am to use these new behaviors as I share my experience, strength and hope in whatever way I am directed.

“Are you looking for ways to “work the Steps” in your program? Why not consider stepping up to service in your Group, District or at the Area? Take a look at the leaflets, “Joy of Service” (S-57) and “Links of Service” (S-28) to see if there isn’t a place for you to add service to your Al-Anon program, an opportunity for you to give back some of what has been given to you and a way to “work the Steps” in a most rewarding way.”

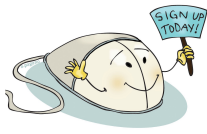
