Public Outreach

Hello NYN Family,

Just having returned from the Spring Assembly & Convention in Rochester, I think this is a fitting topic...“Keeping an open mind”. We had a wealth of information from our Delegate about what was happening in the business of Al-Anon. We also had much information from all our officers and coordinators. The discussion of the Alateen Guidelines raised several questions. Through the years, I have learned the importance of listening. As with many things, I have strong opinions, as do others. Putting principles above personalities is important to me in keeping an open mind. It is a lot about responding rather than reacting to a situation. To keep an open mind, it may mean that I sit quietly, listen and sort out what I understand and what I question. There are times when I don't know what to ask for clarification. I remember that there is a Higher Power in the room helping us to learn and grow. If our decisions are not best for the whole, we will learn, grow and move on. Nothing is written in stone and none of us are perfect.

So we saw the new PSAs that WSO will be releasing soon. With a show of hands, it seemed that the “Challenger” PSA was favored by those attending the Assembly. I will be posting in the next month's article some instructions on how to ask a radio or tv station to carry this message.

I also shared a little of my job description. I wandered around the room and asked members to help carry the message by taking a paper with the picture of an open hand with a key, Our 4th Concept is “Participation is the key to harmony.” My contact info was on the back of the paper **PO@ nynafig.com**

I had a member help me by handing out a bookmark. I asked that you give the bookmark to someone still in need of our program. A “little” act of reaching out. It may not seem like much, but “little” can make a difference. Let me know how it works out. Feel free to share this with others and spread the word.

Send me your ideas for outreach. I love to hear from

members that try new ideas or continue in any way to carry the message. **I want to know: What you did.;** **What happened.;** **What people liked about doing the project.;** **What they liked the least. This can help all of us when we are searching for projects.**

Al-Anon Faces Alcoholism can now be ordered at any time during the year. This is a wonderful outreach tool to give to anyone including professionals. With any information you give out, please try to include a local information service number or contact information.

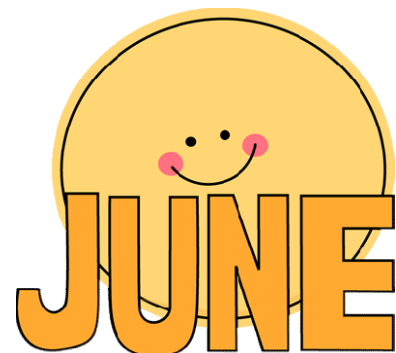

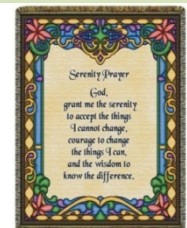
