A special thanks goes out to Cindy R. and her team from District 14 who hosted the 2022 NYN Spring Convention and Assembly! Your hard work was much appreciated!!

The 2022 New York North Area Fall Assembly is scheduled for September, 16, 17, and 18, 2022 and will hosted in a Hybrid form by Districts 6, 10 and 18. The inperson portion of the Assembly will be held at Dwyer Hall at the Immaculate Conception Church, 400 Salt Springs St., Fayetteville, NY 13066. Many of the District 18 and Syracuse AIS Days of Sharing have been held at this location, as well as NYN AWSC Meetings in the late 1990's and the early 2000's. Dwyer Hall can seat 100 + in rounds as well as head tables and tables for Hospitality, Literature, and Basket Raffles. An AV set up is available for Zoom and visual presentations and there is a hospitality area with available coffee makers. Breakout rooms are available for panels or Thought Force committee meetings. There is plenty of parking available at the location. The Craftsman Inn, a local hotel and restaurant is nearby for members who wish to stay overnight.

Maryellen N. from District 12 in Buffalo and her members are considering whether to host the 2023 NYN Spring Assembly and Convention either in an inperson or Hybrid form. District 12 had previously hosted the 2017 Spring Convention and Assembly in Buffalo, NY. I have advised Maryellen and her team that if District 12 decides to host the 2023 Spring Convention and Assembly, either alone or with the help of other Districts, I promised her that I would support her and her committee and offer them any help and guidance that I can, and that the other members and Districts in New York North would do the same. In Al-Anon, we never have to do anything alone. I know that when I first started working on conventions in 1993, I was fortunate to be working with many Al-Anon old-timers in the Syracuse area who had already been working on assemblies and conventions for many years and who tutored me and helped me along the way. Your District will not be alone if you do host an assembly or convention. All of New York North will have your back, as they say.

Our topic this month is "Keep an Open Mind". When I first came into Al-Anon, I was one of those "My Way or the Highway" type of guys. It wasn't because I had such a giant ego, far from it. It was because at home and all through school I was admonished for being wrong and that my ideas were never as good as someone else's ideas. Once I started Al-Anon I started listening to other people and realized that some of their thoughts, sharing's, and ideas made sense to me and I was able to start opening my mind to possibilities that I never even considered before. Becoming active in Al-Anon and Alateen service only strengthened my belief that when we all put our heads together, that the group conscience of Al-Anon does make effective leadership possible.

Despite the assertion that I was described by my late wife as "an educated educator", I was book smart and common sense dumb when it came to my coping with my son's addictions. I could not keep an open mind when it came to him, because his actions and behaviors closed me off from him for many years, and I felt the only solution was to close my mind and isolate from him for my own good. Someone once told me in the program that detachment with love did not involve amputation, but in the old days prior to my entering the rooms of Al-Anon, I was more than willing to wield the figurative bloody ax myself that would sever all ties with my son once and for all.

I look back on those days with revulsion and guilt. All I did was hurt myself in the process of isolation from my son. In the last two years alone, my son has found recovery and peace in his own program. He has found a wonderful place to live in Plattsburgh, a lucrative job with benefits, and a connection to his own serenity that would have seemed impossible back then. I respect his choices, and let him live his own life without interference. I have found that keeping an open mind is the best path to rebuilding a loving relationship with my son, and I thank my Higher Power and the many friends and family members who have aided us over the years.

I encourage everyone to keep an open mind these days, especially with the challenges we all face in our respective lives. I look forward to seeing you in the rooms of Al-Anon at some point. Until then, take a deep breath, think, and live life one day a time.
