Fall Assembly Meeting September 26,2009

Welcome back from the summer in New York North:

Most of my news comes from my ecommunity. The summary of the group conference call became available. As was discussed at the Spring Assembly, subscription number has gone down over the last few years. Ten years ago we had 30,000 subscribers. Five years ago we had about 27,000 subscriptions. Subscriptions as of May have dropped bellow 20,000 for the first time in about 35 years. That's less than 1.4 subscriptions per group. I am very sorry to report that from our last meeting in August until now, Forum subscriptions have gone down in New York state.

The WSO sells the Forum at cost — the cost of printing and mailing. This does not cover the cost of the staff time for editing and the design work. The question was asked during the conference call: How much longer should the WSO subsidize a magazine that engages only a tiny minority of members? I don't emphasis this just to elicit concern. I wanted to bring the numbers back to the membership and give an honest reporting. With that said, August did bring good news on the subscription numbers. Since July subscriptions have increased by a little over 1000 since July.

The ecommunity has started a new monthly feature. I get a sneak preview of the upcoming Forum. In the September's Forum, look to see information about the new 2009 Membership Survey. This survey is presently available on the member's web site; in fact I've taken it. A member from Nebraska has developed a power point presentation on the Forum. It highlights information and ideas from the May conference call. We have permission to show and use this presentation.

Last but not least we have a new group in NYN. The Saturday Night Table Talk group meets in Williamson NY, Saturdays at 8pm. I will be sending out a welcome letter this week. Gratefully Submitted, Gina

5. Then only fill in the spaces that have a change.

WSO & NYN; and they also have a Group Rep. If your group has both then a GR

change would be entered in line 15. Most of our groups have a GR. who is also the

CMA. If I only have one name and address I list them as both CMA and GR.

The Contacts are people in your group that are listed at WSO to receive calls from prospective members in our area to contact.
