 New York Recovery Conference and

Hi Friends.

I hope that everyone had a great summer and is ready for the arrival of autumn. I love that time of year with the smells, cooler weather and most of all the colors that only my Higher Power can paint. So much has been happening since my last article so let me update you. The recertification process has been completed for all AMIAS's (Al-Anon Members Involved In Alateen Service) in New York North (NYN), and here is the breakdown:

130 AMIAS's on the Initial Report received from World Service.

10 New AMIAS's added since January 1st.

26 AMIAS's Inactivated either by their request or failure to recertify.

114 Current number of active AMIAS's in NYN.

Each AMIAS who failed to comply was sent a letter advising them that they are no longer a certified AMIAS and can no longer work with the teens. At the Fall Assembly I will be presenting each District Representative a complete list of all active and inactivated AMIAS's within their Districts. I also inactivated two Alateen groups:

"A Day at a Time" – Binghamton, and "Cloverleaf Alateen" – Tonawanda

Welcome to our new "As Strong as They Come" Alateen Group in Sidney, NY.

I plan on presenting a recommendation at the Area World Service Conference in August to add to our current NYN Alateen Guidelines a process for recertifying all AMIAS's on a yearly basis as required by World Service. If approved it will be voted on at the Fall 2016 Assembly. I will update everyone on the decision in my next article.

There will be an Alateen Outreach Meeting on Saturday, September 10th from 12 noon to 3pm. The meeting will be held at St. Michael's Lutheran Church in Camillus. I sent an invitation to all active Group Sponsors, Alateens and certified AMIAS's in NYN. The purpose of the meeting is to discuss how we can become stronger in spreading the word about Alateen in schools, rehabs, churches and medical facilities. Upon sending a request to Marylou at WSO, she graciously sent me a press release for Alateen along with a poster that we can update and utilize as part of our outreach package.

A couple of years ago World Service published a training module for areas to use to educate new AMIAS's along with keeping active AMIAS's up to date on requirements and guideline changes within Alateen. These guidelines were set forth by World Service and the individual areas in an effort to provide a safe and welcoming environment for our teens. A special thank you to Marybeth G., a Group Sponsor from the Friday Night Camillus Alateen Group for assisting me with this project. I am hoping that once NYNAC (New York North Alateen Conference) is over we can begin doing training workshops for all registered AMIAS's in NYN. I will update you with more information about the module in my October article.

Hello NYN!

I've been on vacation, with the thought of the AWSC meeting this Saturday coming to my mind every once in a while, and another dim thought of writing this month's newsletter article.

Unfortunately, I accomplished little, so I'll just speak to the topic of why I keep coming back to meetings after 44 years.

In the beginning Al-Anon was my lifeline to sanity, something I seriously lacked. As I continued to attend meetings, I learned that I had something to offer such as defining an obscure word, chairing a meeting, being literature coordinator, and eventually group representative. That was when my lifeline held me close when one night my spouse rolled a truck over off Rt. 81. I was 8 months pregnant and dealt with potential death, possible infidelity, and wracking debt. Al-Anon meetings didn't change any of this, but attending meetings and talking to my sponsors saw me through it. NYNAC Letter to Attendees

Greetings All,

It is hard to believe that NYNAC 2016 is only two short months away. We have been able to get Vanderkamp again this year! That having been said, there are a few things we need to address.

The cost for this year's NYNAC will be \$125. The cost of the facility has gone up (but is less than other places we checked into that still had the weekend available). We must have a minimum 30 teens and adults attend in order to break even. We can have a maximum of 17 males and 35 females. This includes the cost of the tee shirts. The cost of the nurse is not included as there was money available from other fundraising efforts. I have contracted for the least number of attendees, but we may add if we exceed 30. It would be fantastic if we do!

Part of the cost increase has to do with linens. We will <u>NOT</u> be allowed to bring in any linens (sheets, pillow cases), towels, washcloths, pillows, blankets, sleeping bags, etc. This is all provided for by Vanderkamp (and also part of the reason for the cost increase). This is due to health concerns. If you have a question about whether or not you can bring something, please figure you cannot, or get to me and ask.

Enclosed you will find registration, medical form and guidelines. Please review the guidelines yourself, and then go over them with your teens. It is very important to get your registrations and registration

fees into me as soon as possible. You may send the registrations and registration fees as you receive them from your co-sponsors and teens. I really must have them by September 20th so I can pay Vanderkamp by September 25th. Your cooperation in this will be greatly appreciated.

Please remember to bring clothing for the season. It can get pretty cold there, so cold weather wear is recommended. Better to have it if you need it than to need it and not have it.

Everyone should bring their own flashlight. Please mark your property so it can be returned if it is left behind.

Should the "Prayer for Today" be removed from the "Just for Today Bookmark and Wallet card and from "How Al-Anon Works?"

At the 2016 Spring Assembly/Convention, Diane C. our NYN Area 39 Delegate reported that during 2015 the WSO Literature Committee began discussing requests from two different members from different areas to make changes to the "Prayer for Today" which is on the *Just for Today* Wallet Card and Bookmark and also on page 101 in "How

Al-Anon Works for Families & Friends of Alcoholics". Using the Knowledge-Based Decision-Making process (KBDM) the WSO Literature Committee reached a decision to recommended the removal of the "Prayer for Today" from the *Just for Today* Bookmark and Wallet Card, and from "How Al-Anon Works". They presented their recommendation to 2016 WSC. (See pg. 57 of the 2016 WSC Conference Summary for more detailed information on this topic.)

After much discussion at the 2016 World Service Conference no motion was made and no vote was taken, as the consensus of the Conference was that the Delegates go back to their Areas for further discussion and revisit the Literature Committee's recommendation at the 2017 World Service Conference.

During Diane's report she asked that the Assembly be given a chance to express their thoughts on the topic during the afternoon session. Approximately 20-30 minutes was given using the 1 time at the mic 2 minute time limit for members to share their thoughts. Below is what NYN members shared.

- My Opinion: Leave the prayer on the bookmark.
- If this is changed (which I do not agree with) change "Lord" to "I ask my Higher Power" and change "O, Devine Master "to "I ask my Higher Power.
- Prayer for Today:

Make me an instrument of serenity". Where there is chaos, let me find peace.

Where there is doubt, confidence; where there is despair, hope; Where there is loneliness, community.

Let it begin with me." And then add the slogans.

- Change first line of each paragraph.
 May I be an instrument of peace.....
 May I not so much......
- Take out all words regarding religion.

- Take what you like and leave the rest.
- Remove the prayer and make the other part bigger. People have issues with God.
- Change Devine Master
- Remove the prayer. It's a religious prayer.
 St. Francis Prayer encourages codependency.
- Is about co-dependency It suggests that I have power. Al-Anon teaches we don't' have the power. We are powerless.
- We are not affiliated with religions, there are many religions besides Christianity. Is this affiliated with organized religion? Yes, I think so. We are spiritual not religious.
- Many people have issues with God and religion.
- This is a Christian prayer and inappropriate for Al-Anon.
- It's seems like codependency- Because if suggests you change others by your activity.
- Not in Al-Anon language. Change:
 God to Higher Power
 Hate to Chaos
 Peace to Serenity
- Remove the prayer and make the print bigger.
- Keep the Prayer
- Leave as is. Too much God things are being taken on out of the world.
- I got spirituality while in the program.
 Everyone is taking God out of everything.
- I love the prayer. Read about the origins from the Oxford Program.
- I was wounded when I came into the program. I love the prayer. I was raised Christian and very codependent. The prayer puts the emphasis on me, it teaches me self-love.

- When I practice the Steps, especially Step 11, I use this prayer.
- I'm not Christian but appreciate this prayer.
- It teaches me to be the best I can be and about my Higher Power's will.
- If it gets remove please replace with something comparable.
- Good ideas come from all people and places.
- Take what you like and leave the rest.
- If we take this out then do we do it to every piece of CAL?
- If it wasn't already there would we be choosing to use?
- Like the thought of to keep it give it away.
 Dark- to lightness.
- Keep the prayer.
- It's not diverse to Christian.
- It's bias.
- What would Lois say?
