Service has been a big boost to my Al-Anon recovery. I got involved in service immediately. I was attending a meeting weekly while I waited for my ODAT (*One Day at a Time*) to come from the W.S.O. in New York City. A member elected me secretary so I could attend the Intergroup meeting. Six months later a friend, myself, and her Sponsor started a group at the Rescue Mission in Syracuse, and I was the Group Representative and she was Secretary/ Treasurer. When Syracuse decided to start an Al-Anon Information Service, I was the first Chairperson. Service gave me a reason to attend meetings when my husband would object to my attendance. Later in my life, I was at a friend's house, who had gone to an A.A meeting and I was feeling lonely. I called my Sponsor to ask her what the sentence in the *Purpose and Suggestion* meant that said,

"When the alcoholic is busy with A.A., you can cure the lonely left-out feeling by becoming active in Al-Anon." She said it was referring to doing service work. So, I left that position with "scratch marks" all over it.


