at the Assembly meeting and to provide an Al-Anon program for the rest of the participants."

At the Spring Assembly meeting, Ruth S., our Delegate, will report on the activities of the World Service Conference held in April, and our Coordinators will present 'two-minute' 'Hot Topic' reports. Our Presentation Committee is planning a workshop on Knowledge Based Decision Making (KBDM). I encourage each Al-Anon/Alateen Family Group to send a representative to the Assembly, where every group in the Area has a voice and a vote in Area business through their representative. Sending your Group Representatives (GRs) to the Assembly is your group's direct link and connection to the Al-Anon Worldwide Fellowship. The Service Manual states the following, "A group that fails to have a Group Representative denies the members a voice and causes a break in the link of communications." All Al-Anon/Alateen members are invited to attend the Assembly meeting; however each group has only one vote in Area business. I hope you haven't forgotten about the statement I made in my last newsletter article about entering you in a raffle for the *Forum* if you tell me at the Assembly that you read my article.

Our Web Coordinator, Emily, has given her resignation. NYN is currently looking to fill the position of Web Coordinator for the remainder of the Panel 52 term, which ends in Dec 2014. Thank you, Emily, for your service to NYN. I have asked Diane C., our Alternate Delegate, to respond to the web inquiries until we are able to find a replacement for Emily. Kathi D. will handle the technical aspects of the position. If you or someone you know within NYN is interested in the position, please contact me at chairperson@nynafg.com. For this month's topic I chose to share on *Tradition Four: Each group should be autonomous, except in matters affecting another group or Al-Anon or AA as a whole.* Tradition Four speaks to me about freedom and responsibility; the freedom each group has, while at the same time it's responsibility to uphold the traditions of the worldwide fellowship as a whole. Each group has the freedom to choose when and where it will meet, if it will be an open or closed meeting, what topics they'll discuss, if they'll use the daily readers or study the steps and traditions. Each group has the

freedom to choose how it wishes to open and close. Some groups choose to close with a prayer, while others might choose the Al-Anon Declaration or a moment of silence. All of these choices are entirely up to the membership of each individual group as long as the decisions of the group have been reached by a group conscience. The second part of Tradition Four speaks about each group's responsibility to the worldwide fellowship. By adhering to the traditions of the program adopted from AA and laid out for us by our co-founders, each group can assure it will not stray from the program's basic principles. If a group is using non-conference approved literature, discussing non Al-Anon related topics or promoting self help philosophies; that dilutes from the primary purpose and unity of the fellowship and has a direct affect on Al-Anon Family Groups as a whole.

I'd like to end this article with a special thanks to Gwenne (Newsletter Editor) for assigning topics to write about. I continue to learn and grow with each new topic.

## Area Delegate, Panel 52:

Dear NYN Friends,

This month's theme is either Tradition Four or Concept Four. I have chosen **Concept Four**, "Participation is the Key to Harmony." For me this has been a wonderful gift of Al-Anon. When I participate, I am a part of the whole: For so long before Al-Anon I didn't feel a part of anything. This belonging has been a spiritual experience for me.

In *Paths to Recovery*, p. 273, Lois W. is quoted: "Anyone can start something, but it takes many people to keep it going." I know this is true and have seen it work over my years in service. This past weekend I went to my first Northeast Regional Delegate (NERD) meeting of current and past NERDs. I can't begin to express how warm and caring a group of Al-Anon members this was; men and woman with years of service in Al-Anon. Next year will be my last year attending the World Service Conference (WSC), but I know that I will always be a NERD. This is a shining example of Concept Four.

Many of you have taken part in NYN's adoption of groups in NYS the past few months. Whether your group or District was able to send a couple hundred dollars worth of CAL or just a couple of daily readers, it was another example of Concept Four; the idea that in giving we receive. All who have taken part have been able to help fellow Al-Anon members on their journey of recovery. If you, or your group or District, have not taken part in this membership outreach project, there is still plenty of need. I have been hearing from groups in NYS who have only just begun meeting again. Not only did they lose their literature with Hurricane Sandy, but also their meeting place. Lastly, I wanted to write a few words about the **search for Regional Trustee**. Last month there was a notice about a one-year appointment of a Northeast Regional Trustee. There was a very short time-line to apply for this position, as it will be filled at this year's World Service Conference in April. The normal term of Regional Trustee is three years. Once the Trustee is appointed to the one-year term, the process to appoint a Northeast Regional Trustee for the last two years of this three-year term will begin. Anyone interested in this two-year term as Northeast Regional Trustee will need to complete a resume. The NYN resumes will be reviewed and voted on at our Spring Assembly/Convention this May in Lake Placid. The resume for NYN's candidate for Northeast Regional Trustee must then be submitted to WSO by August 15, 2013, with the appointment taking place at the WSC in 2014. ## Service Manual SCAVENGER HUNT

**Challenge #6:** Does Al-Anon's principle of anonymity mean that members should not share their last names within the fellowship?

## **Immediate Past Delegate:**

"When a member is new, nothing is expected except his or her own healing; but as time passes, the whirling emotions settle and it is vital to do service for the progress of Al-Anon. Doing service can contribute to our personal growth and development. In this way, we can express our gratitude and repay some of the huge debt we owe to Al-Anon." –Texas, United States, p. 26, As We Understood.

The first time I heard this reading, I was attending the opening dinner for my first year as your NYN delegate at the World Service Conference. These were the words that the chairperson of the Conference had chosen to include in her opening remarks, and they truly resonated with me. I also see a clear connection to the Fourth Concept: Participation is the Key to Harmony.

Early in my recovery I was introduced to service beyond the group level. I was asked to stand in for a Group Representative (GR) who was unable to go to the Area Spring Assembly for a group I had been attending. My eyes were opened to Al-Anon beyond my immediate surroundings and I was hooked on doing more. Soon the group was looking for a representative to the local Al-Anon Information Service, and I was willing to represent the group at the monthly meetings and bring back the information. From here, I went on to fill various positions as GR and District Representative (DR) and eventually, a number of positions at the Area level; each one of these positions allowed me to be a part of Al-Anon and to grow and heal in ways that I could not have imagined when I first entered the rooms of Al-Anon. Today I know I am a better person because I was given the chance to recover in Alanon. Learning to live by the Twelve Steps, Traditions and Concepts in my life allows me to slowly become the me I wish to be.

As I study the word "participation," the dictionary tells me it means "the state of being related to the larger whole." In AI-Anon, the groups are the ultimate authority. It is here that we first learn about participation. For a meeting to happen, chairs need to be set up, literature needs to be set out and the hot water for coffee or tea started. When those arriving early pitch in and do these chores, the meeting can be started on time. When there is a problem that needs to be discussed, the group agrees to a group conscience meeting to discuss the matter, and after a thorough discussion of the matter with all the members of the group, we can

have a vote on how to proceed that is best for the group as a whole. This process is followed at all levels of the Al-Anon program and is seen at its ultimate at the World Service Conference, which is known as the largest group conscience; area delegates along with the members of the Board of Trustees, the Executive Committee and the members of the World Service Office Staff meet annually for the purpose of doing Al-Anon's business.

Whether it's at the group level or at the World Service Conference, we all have a need to belong and to participate. Al-Anon affords us this opportunity to become part of the group by giving of ourselves and also including others. We learn how to treat others as we would have them treat us. This is often referred to as the Golden Rule, a rule many

of us may have with in our up-bringing. said that in keep it, we give it great

Al-Anon is a spiritual program; each of us has a belief in the God of our own understanding; and with that belief to turn to, we find that most of what we do happens with harmony. # Alternate Delegate/Forum Coordinator:

The Fourth Tradition states: Each group should be autonomous, except in matters affecting another group or Al-Anon or AA as a whole. As I read this, I thought of my home group and the other groups in the Worldwide Fellowship. How can we be autonomous but still work for the good of the Fellowship as a whole?

I looked at my Home Group to see how we put this Tradition into practice. One of the things that our group decided to do was to have a six-week series of meetings for the newcomers at the same time as our regular meeting. This gives the newcomers an opportunity to learn about Al-Anon in a smaller group and to be able to ask questions in a more intimate setting. My group also chose to give out Conference Approved Literature (CAL) relating to the topic each week, instead of just one Newcomer Package when they first arrived. Our group decided that we did not want to read from all of the Daily Readers at each meeting, but could refer to them if we wanted to.

However, we still use only CAL in our meetings; and when we do Public Outreach we make sure we are promoting only the Al-Anon/Alateen program. We have invited AA members to join our groups, but ask that they only share on their recovery in the Al-Anon program. However, if they are invited as an AA Speaker at an Anniversary Meeting or Day of Sharing they may share their AA recovery story there.

It is nice to be able to be flexible with our meetings and to do what works for us, such as setting our meeting time, deciding whether we serve coffee and if we have greeters, how we want to spend our finances or how we want to open or close our

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meeting. It also nice to know that because we follow Tradition Four, people can come to our meeting and receive the 'Experience, Strength and Hope' that this program gives here and all over the world. In addition, before our group puts anything into practice, we make sure that it will not hurt AA or Al-Anon as a whole. We want Al-Anon to always be there for ourselves and others who need it.

As the Forum Coordinator, I ask that you please remember to use the Forum in your meetings, encourage members to purchase their own personal copies and share the information about this recovery tool with newcomers. Also, remember that members are the authors of the Forum. It is our responsibility to keep it going by writing something for it and submitting it to WSO. 


