Hurray! Spring has finally arrived and the snow piles are gone. I can finally see the ground.

I can honestly say that this last month has been very busy. I processed paper work to add four new sponsors and one new Alateen Group located in East Rochester which is scheduled to begin meeting in Mid-April. I also attended the AWSC meeting in late March, took part in a special conference call for all AAPP's (Area Alateen Process Person) discussing the recertification process for all AMIAS's and the updating of all groups. The WSO has granted all AAPP's the ability to register all new AMIAS's directly online. The turnaround time for processing is 24 to 48 hours. During the conference call we were also informed that by mid-summer all AAPP's will have the ability to register new Alateen Groups directly online. According to the current report from WSO we currently have 241 active AMIAS's in New York North and 23 active Alateen Groups (NOTE: not all groups are seeing teens weekly).

As part of the recertification process this year I will be sending each AMIAS a questionnaire for them to fill out and return to me by May 22. The purpose of this form is to determine the status of all AMIAS's in NYN. They will be given an opportunity to step down as an AMIAS (if they desire), as well as updating their contact and demographic information. Upon receipt of this information I will process any changes online.

The WSO has mailed out the 2015 ALATEEN ANNUAL UPDATE SHEET for all active groups. I am asking all AMIAS's who are listed as the CMA (current mailing address) for their Alateen Group to complete the form and return it to me by May 15. It is critical that all of this information be updated so that NYN and WSO have the most current information for everyone involved in Alateen service. Failure to recertify can result in a sponsor being inactivated and no longer able to serve.

As an Alateen Sponsor it makes me feel so good to see new faces come into Alateen meetings, both teens and sponsors. I sit and listen as the teens welcome the newcomer, openly share their experience, strength and hope and let the newcomer know they are not alone. Newcomers to Alateen remind me of where I came from and how much I've grown. How rewarding it is to see people come and heal. My prayer is that more and more teens hear the message and join this remarkable program. Love in service,

Happy Spring Everyone,

Our topic for this month is "Newcomers." I think about how I felt coming back into the rooms of Al-Anon; I was so scared, willing to do whatever was suggested. I knew I needed help and Al-Anon was where I turned.

I was greeted by many wonderful and welcoming people. They helped me to feel I had made a good decision. I try and offer such a welcome to the newcomers that I meet today. In the groups that I attend we give each person new to Al-Anon a newcomer's packet, a telephone list, a meeting list, and the paperback version of *How Al-Anon Works*.

In one of the groups that I attend we offer a "Beginners'" meeting. The purpose of a "Beginners'" meeting is to introduce newcomers to Al-Anon in a smaller setting. It is an opportunity for the newcomer to ask questions and discuss what is going on. We have various pieces of Al-Anon Literature (CAL) that we use and we follow the G-2 guidelines that are on the members' website. The format for this "Beginners'" meeting ranges from one to six weeks. It is up to the individual to decide how many "Beginners'" meetings they want to attend. We all start off in the larger group listening to the opening, reading the Steps, Traditions and the daily reading before we break off. That way the "newcomer" gets to experience part of what the regular meeting is like. (I can say that in many ways I still feel like a newcomer to Al-Anon, and for me I think that is a good thing. I never want to forget what it was like to walk through that door.)

Now, for the latest news from WSO. In 2014, Al-Anon PSAs (Public Service Announcements) reached a television audience of more than 700 million people across the U.S. and Canada. WSO sent me a list of the TV stations that did not play the PSAs in NYN and those that did. Only <u>3</u> stations in NYN played the PSAs and they were located in Vestal and Watertown. We are asked to send a thank you to those stations that do broadcast our PSA. I have been in touch with DRs from those areas asking them if they would do so. WSO feels that if we show our appreciation the stations will probably continue to play the Al-Anon PSAs. District Reps and Public Outreach Coordinators in the areas that did not show the PSAs are currently working on contacting their area's TV stations to see if they would be willing to play the PSAs. I'll keep you posted.

This past month I have also written an article for the Rochester AIS newsletter and Council on Alcoholism enews regarding Public Outreach. All websites in NYN have a link for professionals that takes them directly to the WSO website.

In District 29, we continue to pass along *Al-Anon Faces Alcoholism 2015*, meeting lists, our outreach flyer with the local AIS tear off strips at the bottom, as we continue the conversation on how to "carry the Al-Anon message."

In a group I sometimes attend, when a newcomer shows up, we stop everything and focus the meeting on that person, each of us telling his or her personal story. I see that some newcomers are ok with being the center of attention. Others are clearly uncomfortable. I'm uncomfortable too.

In another group I go to, the group numbers off into two sections when a newcomer shows up. One section goes with the newcomer to talk about the first three steps, and the other section discusses the regular topic. Alternatively, I have been to groups that reserved 5-10 minutes at the beginning of the meeting for the newcomer, and then devote the rest of the meeting to the regular topic. A friend of mine goes to a group whose members sign up to chair a standing newcomer meeting, one week at a time.

When a meeting gets focused on one person, I have two big questions:

1. Are we honoring the principle of anonymity in Tradition 12? It shouldn't matter how much time someone has in the program; everyone should get the same amount of attention in a meeting.

2. Are we putting personal progress for one person before personal progress for the greatest number, thus contravening Tradition 1? When a step, tradition, or concept discussion is constantly getting supplanted by a "tell everyone's story to the newcomer" meeting, it's hard to believe that we are really pursuing personal progress for the greatest number.

"right" way to greet newcomers. I'm personally much more comfortable with meetings that do it in a way that complies with the Traditions. If you've

never been to Assembly, there's a new GR meeting before the regular meeting starts on Saturday--another excellent way to greet newcomers! I hope that you'll consider joining us there in May, where we'll use the Traditions and Concepts to help everyone. love in Service,


