## Questions from NYN Al-Anon Assembly on Liability Insurance

- 1. Wouldn't including groups in the coverage use up the limits quickly? Is a \$2,000,000.00 policy enough? In theory, yes with more chapters and more people covered, there is a greater risk of frequency eroding the \$2,000,000 policy aggregate. Additional aggregate limits can be purchased up to \$10,000,000 for \$800 per \$1,000,000.
- 2. Any statistics on how often claims are submitted on this type of insurance? There are more available statistics on Directors & Officers Insurance.

  Specific statistics for General Liability and Improper Sexual Conduct are limited, but when claims do occur, they are usually more in the Severity category.
- 3. If group meetings are covered what about group events held outside of normal meeting hours? What about District activities? All events and activities would be covered only exclusions being certain fundraising activities, say including fireworks. Special Event Coverage can be added if ever needed.
- 4. What would be the process to add a new group to policy? How long from group founding to coverage? A new group, as long as they are considered a member of New York North Assembly, would be automatically covered.
- 5. What about Terrorism coverage mentioned at AWSC meeting? Was cost \$15.00/year? Correct.
- 6. If we were to buy coverage for stolen money the area would need better oversight of how funds are handled. Would insurer have requirements? Employee Dishonesty is a separate coverage estimate of \$25,000 limit for \$150 premium. An application would be needed.
- 7. What don't we know? What isn't covered, what is excluded? General Liability is a broad policy covering exposures to Bodily Injury and Property Damage. The standard exclusions are for things that are "uninsurable" such as intentional actions and war; and those that should be covered under a different policy such as Professional Liability, if for instance you employed licensed counselors or therapists providing services under the blanket of New York North Area Assembly.
