My current schedule is to check the PO Box on Saturdays and to deposit the monies received on Monday. The bank's branch in Oswego is not open on Saturdays. On the last day of the month, recently received checks will be deposited.

Donations received each month will be listed in the next Northern HiLights issue. Contributions amounts will no longer be listed. This decision is based on Tradition One, "Our common welfare should come first; personal progress for the greatest number depends upon unity." and Tradition 4, "Each group should be autonomous, except in matters affecting another group or Al-Anon or AA as a whole." Posting dollar amounts could lead to controversy within a group and/or the Area as each group has its own unique financial situation. Instead, I will provide each group with a semi-annual contributions report.

Obedience to the Unenforceable—What's in a Name?

In *Paths to Recovery* on page 133 there is a quote by Lois W. that reads, "Al-Anon...holds together by means of a loving understanding among its members. Al-Anon is united—without organization, without management without a chain of command or a set of rules—by its members' willingness to be obedient to the unenforceable." It goes on to say that "The Traditions form the framework of common consent within which we may best carry out our activities." I understand this to mean that we have no rules, but we do have principles, and we try to practice these principles in all of our affairs.

Tradition Five reminds us of our primary purpose and part of that is to **welcome** and give comfort to families of alcoholics. And Tradition Three says that the only requirement for membership is that there be a problem with alcoholism in a relative or friend.

How do we welcome the newcomer? When I welcome someone new to my meeting, I start by introducing myself. How does my group welcome the newcomer? It starts by listing its name on a meeting list. The name is an introduction. What does your group name say to a newcomer looking for help? The 2024 World Service Conference approved new language to guide groups in choosing a name. It reads," It is vital that group names are inviting, attractive, and avoid public controversy. Our spiritual growth has its roots in the principle of anonymity, to enhance the sense of belonging and unity."


Is your group's name in alignment with the principles of Traditions Three and Five? Is it welcoming and clear to the newcomer or does it exclude certain members or new members? We are being asked to consider these questions. If your group name is not in alignment with these principles, please consider having a group conscience around this topic and practice obedience to the unenforceable. Amends Vary in Size, Type & Timing

Once I started in Al Anon meetings, the second part of Step Ten: "when we were wrong promptly admitted it" became a mantra. It pushed me to admit my errors quickly, short-circuiting guilty brooding on what people might be thinking or feeling about what I had said or done. It has been a relief—my admissions are kindly received; it turns out perfection is not required.

I have always had a terrible sense of time. My Bio teacher said I had a "faulty biological clock." It may have been a joke, but I leaned into it and, even before Al Anon, when I was late I admitted it as a "chronic" fault and apologized. What I didn't do was make an effort to change. With modern tech and the insights gained in Step Four, I am making progress on a living amends.

I am approaching my eighth step. I rarely hear members in my meetings discuss the larger amends they have made in step eight. Perhaps I need to add a meeting where the steps are on the agenda each month ...oops, me and my bad timing! August was Step Eight! Sigh. I look forward to HP and my sponsor's help in living through this matter of amends—all in good time.
