Register Your Online Group!

NYN or GEA—Where is Your Online Group at Home?

Part of the registration process for Al-Anon electronic groups is determining whether a group wants to register with the geographic Area or with the Global Electronic Area (GEA). The questions below can be used to guide the group in making an informed decision.

- What audience is the group seeking to attract? Are you hoping for members from nearby geographically or around the world?
- Where does the group want to vote and contribute: in its geographic Area or in the GEA?
- Does the group want its meeting information included on both al-anon.org plus a local website such as an Al-Anon Information Service or District meeting directory, or does it prefer to appear only on the global electronic meeting search on al-anon.org?
- Is the geographic Area in which the group is based accepting electronic groups*, and does the Area have a process in place to connect the group to the links of service?

Discussing these questions in a business meeting will help the group decide where to register. Don't hesitate to contact your Area Group Records Coordinator, District Representative, or the World Service Office to answer any additional questions that might arise.

Electronic Groups Within New York North Make Good Sense

We were one of the last areas to make a decision regarding whether to accept fully electronic groups within our Area to become part of our district and area structure. Al-Anon decisions often take time. All offered perspectives are considered, and substantial unanimity is sought.

The recent Assembly decided to adopt the recommendations of a committee formed to investigate the advisability of accepting fully online groups into our Area based on the knowledge available. The decision to go ahead was well considered. Because we were not the first Area to decide, the committee was able to gather the experience of other areas to help them decide on their recommendations.

These were the reasons for going forward with fully electronic groups that I heard discussed at the Assembly, from group discussions and from individuals:

- Some online groups are mainly local and want to participate in district and state activities and decision making, be on local meeting lists, and be supported with the existing District, AIS and Area mentoring and communications. Since our main purpose is to be there for the families and friends of alcoholics, our default answer to such a request should be yes.
- Including online groups makes our ability to reach out to homebound or geographically isolated New Yorkers easier. Rural groups can attract more members if travel to meetings is not required.
- Younger people who are accustomed to online meetings may be more comfortable becoming familiar with our program in that way.
- More meetings available at more times in any given area is a blessing.
- Including our local online meetings gives us a broader population of members in service who can fill various roles in our Area Assembly, Committee work, and Convention planning. It was a pleasure to witness and participate in

the careful and respectful way that decisions are made at the Area level. The process renewed my gratitude for participating in an organization in which there is no authority other than a Higher Power.

NYN Electronic Groups Move Forward

At the 2024 Fall Assembly, NYN voted to accept Electronic Groups into our service structure. Also, a two-year trial period concerning the requirements that must be met to be a part of NYN was approved.

What does this mean? If your Group no longer meets at a physical location AND you haven't already registered with the World Service Office (WSO), you must register your Group within the next six months. If you are currently registered as an Electronic Group, you can now request to belong to the New York North Area (NYN).

For now, the following requirements must be met to belong to NYN:

- The physical address of the CMA and/or GR must be within NYN, or one of the contiguous Areas (NY South, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, Ontario South, Vermont).
- Indicate which existing NYN District best represents their members and request assignment to that District.
- Participate in District, Al-Anon Information Service, and Area Assembly meetings without requesting special accommodations.

The full Policy to Accept Electronic Groups into NYN Area Service Structure is available on the NYN website on the <u>Area Information</u> page.

I want to thank all who worked over the past few years, using the KBDM (Knowledge-Based Decision Making) process to provide us with the necessary information to make an informed decision. Our circle just got bigger!

Alateen Offers Opportunity to Serve

As you may know, no one stood for the Alateen Coordinator service position at the 2024 Fall Assembly held on September 28, so it remains open. I have been acting as the coordinator since January 1, 2024 in order for our Area to keep the link of service connection to the WSO. The Area needs someone to fill this position through December 31, 2026, effective immediately.

Simply put, the Alateen coordinator is a resource for the certified members and the Alateen groups. The Coordinator also supports the service work of the AAPP (Area Alateen Process Person) and the NYNAC (New York North Alateen Conference Coordinator). I have included links to <u>New York North</u> and the <u>WSO</u> where the responsibilities of the position are described. As part of the coordinator's role, attendance is required at the following meetings: four AWSC (Area World Service Committee) meetings plus two Assemblies a year.

When I decided to step into this service position at the 2020 Fall Assembly, I found support for this position from a Super Service Sponsor : the Immediate Past Delegate (also certified AMIAS), the AAPP (Area Alateen Process Person), as well as our other Area officers and coordinators and other Alateen coordinators across the world service structure. WSO also provides support through access to AFG Connects, an electronic platform where coordinators can ask questions or share concerns in order to gain experience, strength, and hope from other coordinators in other Areas.

Remember that Step 12 is about Public Outreach for both Al-Anon and Alateen. It's up to all of us to carry the message: we cannot keep the program unless we are giving it away. I am willing to be a Service Sponsor for anyone that would like to step into this rewarding service position, a unique opportunity to work alongside approximately 40 certified Al-Anon Members Involved in Alateen Service (AMIAS) across the New York North Area.
