## A Change That Confirms Our Inclusive Welcome

One of the things I love about Al-Anon is that we don't swing back and forth between extremes the way our broader society does. We change slowly. We evolve over time, listening to the many perspectives at the group level and up through our links of service. Decisions to make a change take years.

A recent change is that new groups can no longer register group names that include a specific type of participant such as "Adult Children," "Parents," "LGBTQIA+," "Men," or "People of Color." We can still have groups that focus on a particular type of member experience, though it cannot be highlighted in the name of the group.

Why is that? Drawing from our Traditions: "Our common welfare should come first. The <u>only requirement</u> for membership is that there be a problem of alcoholism in a relative or friend."

To achieve this broad inclusiveness while still allowing groups to form around specific shared experiences, groups can continue to specify a participant emphasis in the group description. People searching for a group will still be able to find these affinity groups through the advanced search features on the website.

We don't want to miss that first-time participant, who may be an adult child who walks into a parents' meeting. Perhaps the meeting was organized by parents of alcoholics who feel that they have common problems and solutions that merit a special meeting. Nonetheless, the Principles and Steps we follow are Al-Anon, and if this is the meeting that meets this new members' time and geographic restrictions, we welcome them into our meeting and share our experience and hope, as well as how to find additional meetings in their area and online.

This change reflects an adjustment to our practice, and is not a knee-jerk decision to say no to more focused groups. WSO is also asking existing groups with a specific group identity in their name to consider changing it. As always, groups are autonomous. If in support of our broader goal of being as inclusive as possible, existing groups with an identity group as a part of the group name decide to voluntarily change the group name and update the group description to include the identity, they can do so by going to the Al-Anon World Service Organization Group Records change form online.



It was only when I faced the reality that I had to separate myself from my son's problems in order to get better that I knew I could move forward in my journey toward serenity.

Fifteen years later, I use detachment with love as one of the most important tools in my Al-Anon toolbox. I am so much happier now that I have detached with love from my son's personal journey. He works his program, and I work mine. The physical distance between us (eighty miles) works in our favor; despite the separation between us, we are closer than we have ever been in our relationship. That is the power of the program!

# Conventions—A Reliable Way to Turbocharge Recovery

When I reflect on the many Conventions I've attended over the course of my recovery, what I am most struck by is the *feeling* I tend to have at the end of each of these events—that is, a feeling of inspiration and hope, not just for my own future but also for the future of AA and Alanon. Conventions help me understand the expansive nature of the Program—just how many different types of people are on this journey of recovery, and just how many different paths we can take along the way. Here are just a few ways that attending Conventions has enriched my recovery and helped foster in me a deeper sense of peace and connectedness:

- n. Reconnecting with old friends...and making new ones. When I attend an Al-Anon Convention, I never know whom I'll run into. Naturally, I will generally see friends and acquaintances from my local meetings, but invariably I will also run into friends whom I haven't seen in years, maybe decades. People come and go from our weekly meetings for all manner of reasons, but at Conventions we can connect with long-lost recovery friends in a way that may not happen in any other setting. We are also bound to forge new connections over the course of the event as well. There is no easier place to make new, lasting friendships than at an Al-Anon Convention.
- 2. Having time to explore the Program more deeply. Conventions, as they are generally spread over multiple days, allow me to take a break from everyday life. Suddenly there is time to linger, sometimes for hours on end, exploring the literature table, enjoying Convention speakers, and casually reconnecting with others, with relatively few distractions. In our fast-paced world, this "spiritual leisure time" is a true gift.
- 3. Hearing diverse, inspiring speakers.
  Conventions tend to bring together a wide range of powerful speakers, including some who have achieved national or even international recognition. Having served many times as a panelist myself, it is always an honor to share my story in a Convention setting, and it's an even greater blessing to hear so many other highly entertaining and incredibly wise speakers, some of whom may have traveled long distances to be there, and share. In a phrase, Convention speakers are high octane fuel for recovery.
- 4. **Play.** Al Anon Conventions are fun. Whether through dances, Karaoke, swimming, games, or a lively banquet, Conventions provide both ample opportunity and powerful motivation to have fun. For many of us, having fun is hard work, but being in a supportive group makes it all so much easier...

When it comes to Al Anon Conventions, we will each discover our own benefits, but to do so we need to actually attend one—hope to see you there!

together


Helping one another to be the best persons we can be Initiating contacts that will last a lifetime Promoting the message of Al-Anon in every aspect of our time together.
