## New Series: My Service Work in Al-Anon

*To inform members about the service opportunities in Al-Anon, I am soliciting accounts of experience. Below, a member who chairs Outreach through the Rochester AIS outlines the why and how of those efforts. Welcoming newcomers and attracting participation through the example of our own recovery are forms of outreach that every member can contribute. Organized efforts to inform the public depend on people willing to step up in service to coordinate distributions of materials and responses to outside requests for tabling and presentations. —editor*

### WHY PUBLIC OUTREACH IS IMPORTANT TO ME

Hi, my name is Dennis. I began attending Al-Anon in 1994. My first attempts at recovery were not as successful as I would have liked. My motives for attending meetings were not to learn more about myself and grow. Al-Anon members were friendly and let me know that, as the newcomer, I was the most important person in the room. At the end of the meeting, I didn't feel very important. Group members connected with one another, and I felt out of place. I take responsibility for my lack of confidence and failure to engage with other members. However, I eventually stepped away from Al-Anon for a number of years before returning in 2002.

As I returned, with the help of a trusted friend, I learned that sitting in a meeting was only part of the legacy of Al-Anon. I learned that service could move me along in my recovery. My first service position was as greeter for my home group. This service position gave me the opportunity to get to know other Al-Anon members in a way that I would not have gotten by just sitting in a chair at a meeting. Members also came to know me.

As time went on, I became an Information Service Representative (ISR), responsible for bringing information back to my home group. This position helped me learn more about the workings of the larger Al-Anon community.

For the last three years, I have been the Public Outreach Chairperson at our Rochester Area Information Service. So why is this position so important to me? Honestly, I've personalized the position. I remember what it was like for me in the beginning. I felt alone, out of place and, on some level, unwelcome. From many years in the program, I still see this: Many newcomers at meetings feel much of what I felt in my early days. I am keenly aware that there is such a short period of time to help newcomers not just to feel like they are "the most important person in the room," as we say, but also to know that they are in the right place, through the attraction of first impressions. I see this as one of my most important duties as Chair of the Outreach Committee.

Our Public Outreach helped to establish an online Beginners Meeting which meets each

Saturday. This meeting was created as a venue to help newcomers become more aware of the Al-Anon processes and how they work

The other responsibilities of the Public Outreach Committee are to bring greater awareness of Al-Anon to Rochester and surrounding communities. Public Outreach committee members do this by distributing Al-Anon literature, in the form of flyers, pamphlets, and books, to local libraries and programs. Books are generally donated by individual groups after a call for support by Public Outreach committee members. Committee members also leave flyers at local post offices, outpatient treatment programs, doctors' offices, and police stations.

Committee members attend and participate in local health fairs. At these events, the volunteers are able to interact with other like-minded programs. This affords members the chance to learn more about programs in the area and at the same time share our experience, strength and hope with the programs in attendance.

Public Outreach members have been invited to do presentations at programs providing counseling services to youth and adults both in the Rochester area and in Lyons, NY.

One committee member has arranged an Al-Anon informational session four times in the month of September at the Public Library in Newark, NY. She distributes flyers letting her community know she will be there and makes herself available to answer questions about Al-Anon and share her experience, strength and hope.

The Al-Anon program has been of great, great value to me. It is my hope that, in being present in the many ways as described above, that in a small way, the program becomes attractive enough to others and they will step through the doors of Al-Anon for the gifts that are offered inside. I thank all members who make this work possible. Without their willingness to step into service, this work would not be possible.

## Theme: Sponsorship

### The Joy of Sponsorship

During our 2025 Spring Assembly in Henrietta, New York, one of our sessions involved a creative activity focusing on sponsorship. Using art supplies, old issues of ***The Forum***, and our imaginations, we got to depict our take on being a sponsor, having a sponsor, or being on the hunt for a sponsor.

My final product involved an acrostic poem spelling out sponsorship and two images from an issue of ***The Forum***. The poem came out like this:

Sharing  
Promise  
Ownership  
Novelty  
Safety  
Offering  
Relationship  
Serenity  
Hope  
Imagination  
Power

In the past month or so, I was approached by a newcomer who asked if I would be willing to be her sponsor. I accepted the invitation, and the connection between us has been beneficial and symbiotic for both of us since our first meeting.

We have been **sharing** each other's stories with the **promise** that we will be completely upfront and honest with our sharings. Both of us express the need for **ownership** and responsibility in this arrangement. Coming from similar backgrounds (both retired teachers) and yet completely different geographic origins (New York versus California) has introduced a **novelty** that we will explore further.

Both of us agree there is a feeling of **safety** in our roles, **offering** each other comfort and support as we build a mutual **relationship** of respect and understanding. Our goals focus on the attainment of **serenity** and **hope** through the use of our **imagination** in our weekly discussions and exchanges. The **power** that we exert **in amping up our program** through connection as sponsor and donee is exciting and life-affirming.

When I look at the two images from the issue I mentioned earlier, **they add dimension to how I see our roles**. A blurred image of a gathering reminds us that Al-Anon helps bring things into focus. The other image of a bird eating from a person's outstretched palm reminds us to welcome with open hands the seeds of recovery.

Sponsorship is a gift in the program of Al-Anon that keeps on giving.

### Sponsorship and My Journey in Al-Anon

I believe wholeheartedly that every component of the Al-Anon program contributes to my well-being. I also believe that this is true for anyone in the program. If you want a good life, you need to embrace it all—attending meetings, having a sponsor, working the Steps, reading CAL daily, doing service, and connecting with other members between meetings.

I'm not someone who can say I've had the same sponsor for twenty years, even though I got my first sponsor, Kay, very soon after attending my first meeting two decades ago. I'm a doer, so I jumped right in. I thought I was ready for Step Four almost immediately, but Kay kept smiling and gently saying no—I wasn't ready yet. She lovingly guided me through the first three Steps and got me started on the fourth step before moving out of state.

My second sponsor, Rozanne, picked up right where Kay left off. We worked through the rest of the Steps together, with a few mini-revisits to Step Four when I needed a deeper dive into something I was facing. Before beginning a new Step, Rozanne would ask me to read every CAL reading on that Step. Her sponsor had asked it of her, and I have since asked the same of my donees. Hearing many voices provides a strong foundation for beginning new work.

When my sponsor developed health problems, we stopped meeting. I went years thinking that completing the Steps meant it wasn't a big deal not to have a sponsor. Then one day a niece, new to her own 12-step program, asked me, "Titi Betty, tell me about your sponsor." It felt awful to admit I didn't have one. I went right out and got one.

Joy became my third sponsor. During our time together, my work life was extremely stressful, and she helped me learn to truly use the slogans. When I first entered the program, the slogans felt too simple to be meaningful—but I was wrong. Joy helped me re-engage with my program in a conscious, intentional way. As her husband's health issues increased, I began to feel like a burden, and I knew it was time for a change.

My fourth sponsor is Sandy, a program friend for years. She knows me well, and I love her dearly. I bring joy, frustration, problems, and exciting news to her, and she helps me look at my responses to life through the Al-Anon lens.

Having a sponsor—and being one—keeps me accountable and aligned with my highest intentions. Sponsorship continues to be one of the greatest gifts of my Al-Anon journey.
